Looking Forward
100 Club
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Welcome to this, the 8th Edition of our newsletter which I hope will show you the progress that can be made with your continued support. But first a quick update on Sylvia, who you may remember featured on our blog while we were in Uganda and was mentioned in the previous newsletter. Sylvia is now being properly looked after by a lady, known to Livingston and her sponsorship is meeting her immediate needs. Her smiles are still a bit far and few between but we are reliably informed that she is well, which is fantastic news for all of us.



Following their successful study trip to each of the schools in August last year Berkshire Scouts who are working in partnership with BBF have now committed to funding and building an EGGS project for Bukeka and rebuilding the school kitchen. During their trip they also saw a need to provide clean drinking water and will be looking at identifying some funding to construct a proper and hygienic borehole at the existing water source. The main team will spend 6 weeks in Uganda and around 90 scouts will join them over 3 week periods. The work at Bukeka is new, major project work and whilst the teams will spend some time at each school, the work at Kavule will be mainly maintenance. In addition to working everyone will be given the opportunity of taking part in some adventurous activities such as climbing Mt. Elgon, white water rafting and a safari. Both schools are eagerly awaiting their arrival and past experience should ensure that their visit will be lifechanging in so many ways. We wish them well in both their fund raising and on their trips and we look forward to hearing their progress in all respects.

KAVULE SCHOOL

Since our visit last year there has been more progress made at Kavule School. The award from the World of Children mentioned in our previous newsletter has enabled the campus

to be fenced. In order to maintain security and safety this was much needed and we are delighted it is now complete. Another issue which was frequently raised was teacher accommodation. For some time now some of the teachers have been using a corner of their classroom as their main living accommodation. This is not good for morale and whilst it has been discussed with Sam on many occasions we have not had the funding to build a dedicated unit for them. Now, thanks once again to the award money from America they have been able to complete the building of a classroom block which was started some years ago by another charity but not finished. Livingstone in consultation with BBF has discussed with Sam that part of this building should be used for teacher accommodation and it is hoped that by next term this will be the case. Future plans are that we can also provide guest accommodation which will enable other visitors to stay.

The sponsorship of children continues to bring in much needed funds and whilst it is not quite enough to cover full costs of boarding, food and education it certainly goes a long way towards it. We are currently sponsoring 50 children, so thank you sponsors—you make such a difference.

Last year Farnham Scout Shop donated over 30 sweatshirts and t-shirts which are no longer worn in UK. One of our 2010 team members, John Sharpe, who also runs a scout shop has donated 40 more and our thanks to Woking Scout Shop who recently donated another large box of the same. We are hoping that Berkshire Scouts will have enough room to take everything with them this summer.
